Rescue Company 6303 is equipped to assist the personnel of Navy Lakehurst Fire & Emergency Services and the volunteer fire personnel we respond with to handle the following emergency situations:

Rescue Company 6303 is equipped with a full compliment of Lukas/Hurst hydraulic rescue tools, as well as a complete complement of rope rescue equipment, confined space rescue equipment as well as many other specialized pieces of technical rescue equipment. All equipment for technical rescue and vehicle extrication is NFPA approved and maintained in accordance with NFPA standards.

EMERGENCY HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE UNIT & WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION RESPONSE



The Navy Lakehurst Fire & Emergency Services is equipped to handle various hazardous materials events, which require personal protective equipment to level the “A” protection, thus being capable of handling almost all incidents from level “A” to level “D”. The unit is equipped with chlorine kits, detection kits and has a full compliment of decontamination and containment equipment. Further equipment includes awning to shelter personnel in harsh conditions of summer. The hazardous materials unit is also capable of responding to Weapons of Mass Destruction events or possible terror events to assist local authorities in rescue and recovery as well as monitoring with the departments specialized monitoring equipment in the WMD Advanced Portable Detector which is capable of detecting irritants, chemical weapons and nerve agents.

As well as the department’s wealth of equipment the reference material which is essential to hazardous materials and weapons of mass destruction response the unit is equipped with a wealth of interactive and paper reference materials from the 2000 Emergency Response Guidebook to the interactive computer system for hazardous materials, CAMEO.

Dispatching Navy Lakehurst F&ES and Establishing Mutual Aid Agreements Questions & Answers

What services are available to my fire company from Navy Lakehurst?

All of our emergency services are available to aid the departments that request any of our services. You simply need to request the response of the department through Ocean County

Do I have to sign a mutual aid contract in order to call for assistance from Navy Lakehurst?

No, you do not need a mutual aid agreement to call for our services; simply request the fire and emergency services division of Navy Lakehurst when you need it.

What are the benefits to establishing and maintaining a mutual aid agreement with Navy Lakehurst Fire & Emergency Services?

There are many benefits in establishing and maintaining mutual aid agreements with Navy Lakehurst F&ES. Our services are available (24) hours a day, seven days a week and we always have qualified personnel responding to aid and supplement the man power of your department when needed.

Navy Lakehurst F&ES provides specialized emergency services that can be very beneficial to a department in establishing a mutual aid agreement. Training between the two agencies can be established as well as our response complimenting and providing an adequate response for technical rescue, HAZ-Mat and WMD response just to mention a few.

During the daytime hours when manpower may be low, a mutual aid agreement could utilize the Navy Lakehurst F&ES to respond to your department's daytime calls to aid in manpower and supplement the volunteer staffing in your community.
