**NAVAL AIR WARFARE CENTER AIRCRAFT DIVISION LAKEHURST
DESIGNATED FOOT-HAZARDOUS OCCUPATIONS/OPERATIONS**

1. Definitions

a. Foot-Hazardous Operations. Those operations which afford a source of potential injury to unprotected feet should an item of sufficient weight fall, slip, or roll. Trades or ratings generally associated with a high incidence of foot injuries are those engaged in industrial shop operations, construction, materials handling, maintenance, transportation, aircraft repairs, and test site operations.

b. Foot-Hazardous Areas. Those buildings or shops which encompass numerous foot-hazardous operations. Office spaces are excluded.

3. All military personnel working in counterpart with civilian trades listed above are to be considered eligible.

4. All personnel required to report Temporary Assigned Duty (TAD) to any shipyard, ship, or field activity where hazardous testing/work is being conducted will be considered eligible.
