On 12 January 2004 the Navy Lakehurst Fire & Emergency Services was dispatched to a motor vehicle accident at Gate # 4 and Route 547 in front of NAES Lakehurst. Upon arrival of Assistant Chief Daniel Lyon, the shift's operations commander, he reported the vehicle to be overturned with the driver of the vehicle partially ejected from the vehicle as a result of the accident.

Along with the response of the assistant chief, Engine Company 6321, Rescue Company 6303 and Med-1 responded to the call. Upon arrival of the emergency units, medical assessment of the patient was conducted and it was determined that the trauma sustained from the accident required rapid transportation to a regional trauma center. Assistant Chief Daniel Lyon, under the request of EMS personnel, requested that the New Jersey State Police Med-E-Vac be dispatched to the incident to transport the patient, by air, to Jersey Shore University Hospital.

The Navy Lakehurst Fire & Emergency Services was assisted by MONOC paramedics in the treatment of the patient, as well as South Star Med-E-Vac, who transported the patient from NAES Lakehurst. In addition to the units on scene, Navy Lakehurst Crash-Fire-Rescue crews stood by while the Med-E-Vac conducted operations on-board Navy Lakehurst.

#### Driver, 63, 'critical' after car overturns

**MANCHESTER:** A

63-year-old township man was critically injured yesterday when his car flipped over on Route 571 near the Lakehurst Naval Air Engineering Station, police said.

The man, Rosario Mannino, suffered a head injury and was flown by helicopter to Jersey Shore University Medical Center, Neptune. He was in critical condition late yesterday, a hospital spokeswoman said.

Police are unsure what caused Mannino's Ford Escort to overturn. Officers had not interviewed him by late yesterday, authorities said.

The accident was under investigation by Officers Patrick Morgan and Daniel Miljenovic.
